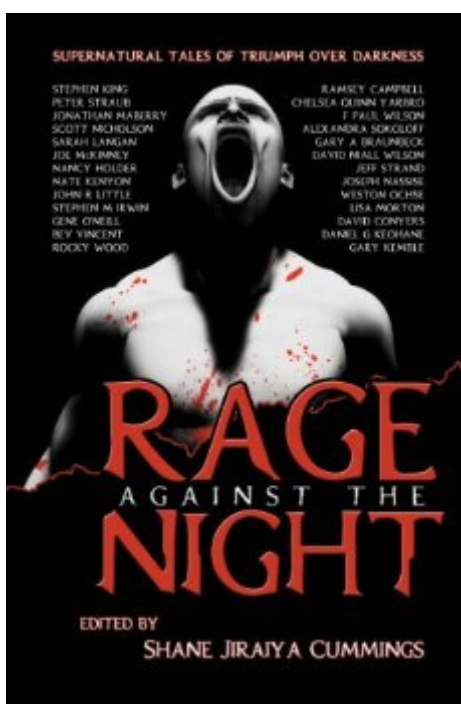

I loved it, really enjoyed a lot of the stories within, and of course it supported a great cause. Of course no one will like everything published in any anthology, but you focus on the stories you do enjoy, and from there look for other pieces written by those authors. The only reason this collection got 4 stars instead of 5 for me, and I can't believe I'm the only person to mention it, was the insane amount of mistakes, I'm talking 'there' instead of 'their' and similar, as well as some stranger ones

like... oh I'm struggling to think, I should have written this when they were fresh in my mind, but for instance words like belly being replaced with belie. Not a spelling mistake, per say, but clearly the wrong word. And very, very few of the stories in the collection were immune from these mistakes, and I'll tell you, they were constant, kind of cute at first, but in the end they were too consistent, too distracting, and I felt like I was editing something for a friend. I'm pleased to say that Stephen King's entry was one of the few that was unaffected by this bizarre phenomenon.

As a book, I liked it, but I did find some stories were just not my taste, which was expected, given the number of different writers involved. It did give me 2 more writers that I now want to read more from.

The stories were pretty good as they were, but, someone needs to do some spell checking. I have read hundreds and hundreds of books and I have never read a book of short stories where just about every story had spelling or punctuation mistakes. I have read books of several hundred pages where sometimes I have found one or two mistakes that were missed. I find that acceptable in a document of that length. The mistakes in these stories were distracting, too many in a short story, and all of them had mistakes. Unless I know the writer is an eight year old, that many mistakes is not acceptable. Maybe it was just the kindle edition, I don't know.

Loved this great collection of horror stories by some legends of the craft, as well as some lesser known writers (to me at least). I love short stories, and this collection certainly satisfied by need for the horrific and gory. All proceeds for this book go to a great cause as well, so I just had to pick it up! If you're looking for some good horror to while away the time without reading a full-length novel, consider *Rage Against the Night*, it's well worth your time! Two thumbs up! :)

This is a collection of short stories in the horror genre; saving the world from forces of evil. I picked this collection up as I noticed it contained a story by Stephen King; one of my all-time favourite authors. Granted it was one already published, but I wanted to compare it to some of the authors I had not had the chance to read before. The collection was a bit of a hit and miss with me. I really enjoyed some of the stories while others ended and I had no idea what I was supposed to have read. I hate that dissatisfying feeling where you finish reading something and realise you have just wasted minutes of your day for something you didn't enjoy. Luckily it didn't happen very often here and I did learn of a few new authors I would like to try out. Unfortunately I was shocked at the editing

mistakes-surely with such a large collaboration there might only be a few mishaps? Not in this however; almost every story had some sort of error creeping through it. Worth it if you want to find new authors, but if you are looking for a gripping horror collection; just average.

I downloaded this collection of stories because I have been a fan of Stephen King since the 80's. I enjoy all his works, novels, short stories, movies, and TV shows. So I was so happy to find a collection of other good authors who also write horror stories. The title of the book says it all, *Rage Against the Night*. The general theme is people fighting against darkness and evil. I like reading short stories (especially scary ones) during the summer. You can read one while traveling in the car, sitting by a pool or beach, staying in a hotel room, staying at a relatives's house, sitting in the park, in your backyard lawn chair, in your tent camping or sitting on the couch with a fan blowing on you. And then find yourself being a little scared because there could be someone lurking behind a tree or something creeping down the hallway... While reading these stories on my kindle, I took notes on which stories were my favorite so I could look up books they published. It's always fun to find new authors. So far I downloaded *The Keeper* by Sarah Langan and really really liked it, finished it in a day. I am going to read more of her books next. Then go back to my kindle notes and read more authors. (One author was way too political and I won't be reading any more of her books. I may agree with some things, but no one likes to be preached at in a piece of fiction, we get enough on facebook and in unwanted emails from friends and relatives.) I recommend this collection of scary stories, to the constant readers and fans of horror, you know who you are. The ones looking behind shower curtains, seeing something move under a bed, or getting a little freaked out when we stare in the mirror for too long...
